Colugos & Tree shrews



Colugos are arboreal gliding mammals found in South-east Asia. They are the most capable of all gliding mammals, using flaps of extra skin between their legs to glide from higher to lower locations. They are also known as cobegos or flying lemurs, though they are not true lemurs.

The treeshrews are small mammals native to the tropical forests of Southeast Asia. Treeshrews have a higher brain to body mass ratio than any mammals, including humans, though this is not uncommon for animals weighing less than a kilogram. Among orders of mammals, treeshrews are closely related to primates, and have been used as an alternative to primates in experimental studies of myopia, psychosocial stress and hepatitis.
